MESSAGE FROM OUR PRESIDENT:

I hope that all members enjoyed the Christmas break and returned to Probus refreshed and ready for the busy period ahead that includes our Annual General Meeting in March and the Changeover Lunch in April, followed immediately by Easter. We have learnt to live with Covid so the aim this year must be to lift our membership.

TREASURER'S REPORT:

After working with nine Presidents and six Secretaries over recent years this will be my final report, thank goodness. I am looking forward to having a little more time for myself.

Club funds at 28 February were \$2,760 after excluding SIG funds and Function Income in advance. Given that the Club is budgeting for a deficit in 2023/24 there is little capacity to subside any functions for the time being.

We have applied to City of Boroondara for a transport grant to assist with transport costs for to the Winter Lunch and theatre events. Whilst I believe we will be successful, advice is not expected to be received until early July.

The Annual Fee for 2023/24, subject to approval at the AGM, is \$75 for members under 90 and \$25 for those 90 and over on 31 March 2023. The fee is due on **31st March**, and as was the case this year, the preferred method of payment is direct deposit to our bank account at Westpac - BSB 033 054 Account 18 2752. Meet in the Schwerkolt Cottage car park at **9.45am** for a **10 am** start of the tour of the Museum and Cottage. The cost of the tour is **\$7.00** per person.

August and Paulina Schwerkolt migrated from Germany as newlyweds in 1849 and lived for a time in Northcote. In 1861 they purchased 63 acres in Mitcham to support their growing family. August cleared the land for a farm with an orchard, vines, dairying, poultry, beehives & wine-making. In 1884 August & his sons excavated stones from a nearby quarry to build Schwerkolt Cottage.

After the guided tour of the Museum and Cottage, participants have a choice of wandering around taking photos, looking at other historic buildings such as the smokehouse, the wine cellar & orchard sheds or sitting and having a chat in the Schwerkolt Cottage picnic area.

There is also 'The Little Buddy' café at 91 Loughnan Road, Ringwood, which is just a two-minute drive from the Cottage for those wanting to have lunch. It should be a very pleasant and informative outing. As always wives, partners and friends are very welcome to participate in our events. **Board out today.**
